

3. Fold in half on the dotted line, then stand the bear up.

# BULL


**Directions:**

1. Print this page and decorate with Crayola® Crayons or Markers.



2. Cut out each piece and glue to a piece of thin cardboard, such as a recycled cereal box or manila folder.

3. Cut a piece of cardboard tube 3 inches long. Glue the cardboard tube between the front and hind leg pieces. Glue the head to the front of the bull.

Tip: If you want the head to be bouncy, attach it to the body using a piece of thin cardboard folded accordion-style.







STAND-UP


1. Print out this page and color with Crayola crayons or markers. Glue page to a thin piece of cardboard, such as a recycled cereal box or manila folder.

Pull the neck and head out and pinch the bases so they stay. Spread out the swan's body and it will stand up!





You can decorate the square's front and back with colorful art before you fold your swan!

# STAND-UP Horse



## Directions:

3. Cut a slit on each dotted line. Fit the pieces together by matching the letters and sliding the slots into each other.










2. Cut out the other shapes from the printed page. Glue the matching shape to the back of each cardboard piece.

# Tiger


## Directions:

3. Fold in half along the solid line, so your sheep stands up. If you want, draw a picture of a field or farm and use it as a background for your sheep.


